K-12 Funding

Foundation Funding: Alaska's primary vehicle for distributing funds to school districts

- Educational dollars in the Foundation Program \$1.3 billion
- HB57 increased the BSA from \$5,960 to \$6,660 (\$700 increase per student)
- HB57 Pupil Transportation increased by 10%
- Revised Payment Structure reflecting the increased BSA



Pre-K Average Daily Membership Districts

- Since 2023, participation has continued to grow.
- 13 districts throughout Alaska: Anchorage, Annette Island, Bering Strait, Chatham, Fairbanks, Kenai, Ketchikan, Mat-Su, North Slope, Petersburg, Skagway, Southeast Island, and Valdez.
- Anticipated ADM for FY2026 124,679.35
- Data collection begins in October, with the final report expected in the first quarter of 2026



Major Maintenance Funding

Building a bright future for Alaska's students

Regional Education Attendance Area (REAA) received \$17.2 million

• FY2026 total: \$39,063,647

• FY2026 will see an increase in major maintenance projects – from three to SIX!

Expanding Education Opportunities

The FY2026 budget increased access to expanded opportunities outside of K-12

• HB 148: 4.6% increase in student financial aid programs

- FY2026 Budget:
 - ➤ Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS): \$2,404.2 million
 - ➤ Career and Technical Education (within APS): \$960,000
 - ➤ The Alaska Education Grant: \$1,235.3 million

Department Budget Highlights

FY2026 Reductions

Teacher Recruitment and Retention (TRR) Reduction - \$1.5 Career and Technical Education (CTE) Reduction - \$1.2 School Board/Commissioner Travel Reduced - \$132.6

Educational programs continuing via prioritization

- ✓ Growing apprenticeships for teachers and principals, and alternative certifications
 - ✓ Expanding access to career guidance in rural districts
 - ✓ Expanding programming for electrical and plumbing careers
 - ✓ Maintaining support for Career and Technical Student Organizations
