Alaska State Museums Recognized as One of Nation's Outstanding Libraries, Museums with Top Honor Awarded at Washington, D.C. Ceremony

Noted Journalist Cokie Roberts, National Archivist, among ceremony presenters

- WHAT: The Director of the Institute of Museum and Library Services, Dr. Kathryn K. Matthew, will honor outstanding museums and libraries with the 2017 National Medal for Museum and Library Service in a ceremony at the National Archives Museum in Washington, D.C., on July 17. She will be joined by journalist and author Cokie Roberts. Ten institutions representing cities from across the country will receive the highest recognition awarded by the federal government to museums and libraries for service to their communities. A member of the community of each recognized institution will join the museum and library directors in the ceremony and share how the institution has impacted his or her life. This year's National Medal winners are:
